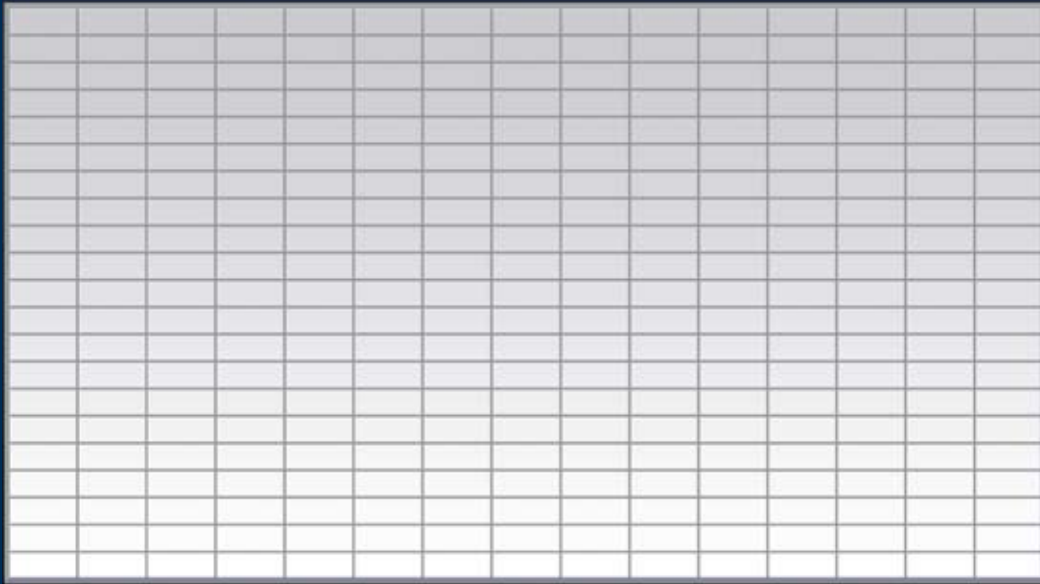

The entire plaque will have room for 300 donor names and messages. Your personal marker can be the message of your choice. Perhaps honoring your family. A Jupiter pioneer. A local business. A civic club. A homeowner's

association. Or perhaps you'd just like to write some lines on what the county's oldest landmark means to you.

Each of the 300 markers will be 4 x 1.5 inches, with silver-toned background and black etched print, just as in the sample below. The top line, for your name or organization, can be in 20 pt. type. You may have up to four supporting lines at 14 pt. type.

After you've created the message that's unique to you, just fill out the form on the reverse side, write a check for \$300 to the Loxahatchee River Historical Society and mail it in your own envelope. Or you can choose to pay by credit card and simply mail back the detached card below. We will acknowledge receipt and tell you whether your message correctly fits the format for a donor marker.
