**Family Adventure Day on Jan. 21st brings back local history & nature organizations  
for the first time since 2020 to the Jupiter Inlet Lighthouse & Museum**

**Event promises exploration and family fun on the waterfront as local friends Ah-Tah-Thi-Ki Museum, Florida Public Archaeology Network, Loggerhead Marinelife Center join in the exciting line-up of interactive heritage adventures**

January 9, 2023 – Jupiter, Fla. – The community is invited to experience a fun-filled ‘Family Adventure Day’ on Saturday, January 21st, with history & nature-inspired education & adventures planned at the Jupiter Inlet Lighthouse & Museum, 500 Captain Armour’s Way in Jupiter. The waterside event exploring the theme ‘Discovering Jupiter’ takes place from 10:00 a.m. – 4:00 p.m. and offers timed-ticket entry. Online tickets are \$5 per child, \$10 per adult, FREE for children 5 & under.

Not since 2020 has the Jupiter Inlet Lighthouse & Museum been able to invite local organizations back to participate at the event due to COVID-19. The 2021 & 2022 Family Adventure Days were reimagined to offer families an opportunity to enjoy the day and theme but in individual family groups exploring a no-frills style history hunt with a map. This year will combine the return of organizations offering unique interactive experiences with the fun of a history passport.

Attendees are invited to ‘travel back in time and choose your own adventure’ with living history, storytelling, games, music, art & crafts, and hands-on activities. Children receive a Lighthouse activity backpack, adventure map and history passport upon admission.

**What’s available at the event?**

Family Adventure Day will be joined by friends from Ah-Tah-Thi-Ki Museum-Seminole Tribe of Florida, Loggerhead Marinelife Center, Florida Public Archaeology Network, Florida Fish & Wildlife Conservation, River Center, Jupiter Inlet District and Bureau of Land Management providing family-fun and educational activities.

Families can also discover the nature trails of the Jupiter Inlet Lighthouse Outstanding Natural Area and receive a Jr. Park Ranger Booklets provided by the Bureau of Land Management.

Families will be able to visit the Lighthouse, Tindall Pioneer Homestead, Keeper’s Workshop, and historic grounds, shoreline pier, nature pathway, and food concessions. Collect stamps in your history passport while exploring the site and participating in educational fun!
