'Family Night at the Light' invites Autism community to experience 'history at your fingertips' with free admission, creative, sensory activities on April 25 at the Jupiter Inlet Lighthouse & Museum

April 10, 2018 – Jupiter, Fla. – An evening of family-friendly activities, learning and treats, planned especially to support the experience of the Autism community is planned 5:30 p.m. – 7:30 p.m. Wednesday, April 25 at the Jupiter Inlet Lighthouse & Museum, 500 Captain Armour's Way, in Jupiter.

'Autism Family Night at the Light – History at Your Fingertips,' offers free admission to *climb the lighthouse, and a variety of hands-on, sensory activities for all ages to enjoy. Visitors can paint a mural, play musical instruments, build with blocks, and visit The Keeper's Workshop, Tindall Pioneer Homestead and Native Garden. Ice cream and Dune Buggy Hot Dogs will be available for purchase.

Following the event, at dusk - and the next day, on April 26th - visitors and onlookers by sea and shore are invited to view the Jupiter Inlet Lighthouse as it lights up in recognition of the greater Autism Community in April's National Autism Month. Throughout the year, the Jupiter Inlet Lighthouse & Museum partners with charitable, non-profit organizations by changing the color of the landmark's beaconing light, in a display of community support for organizations and the work of their life-changing missions.
