Now anyone can capture spectacular, beautiful views from the top of the Jupiter Inlet Lighthouse – anytime, anywhere, online! A new, state-of-the-art camera, poised atop Jupiter's iconic 'Light' brings stunning views of the Jupiter Inlet in real-time- with 24/7 LIVE camera feeds. "The Lighthouse is the heart of the community and everyone loves the view from the top. Now you can keep it on your phone or device and see it whenever you need a Lighthouse break, it's like taking a little piece of the Light with you everywhere you go," comments Stuve. "The timing of the camera's completion couldn't be better. Many have commented to us how much they miss the view from the top during our hiatus. But we've been very busy working on this and other virtual projects for students & the community," says Stuve.

In addition to enjoyment, the live camera feed has practical benefits for boaters and outdoor enthusiasts, giving them a first-hand look at weather and inlet conditions before heading out on the water. The camera also offers people of all abilities the same real-time birds-eye view from the top of the 1860 Lighthouse.

The live camera comes as the Loxahatchee River Historical Society, the nonprofit organization dedicated to fostering education, and advocacy for historical, and environmental protection and preservation, prepares to celebrate the 160th Anniversary of the Jupiter Inlet Lighthouse on July 10th.
